We invite you to assume the post as an affiliated nonresidential scholar with USC Shoah Foundation—The Institute for Visual History and Education as part of our newly-established Nonresidential Scholar Program. This program has been designed to offer full access to our Visual History Archive (VHA), research support and opportunities to scholars outside of VHA access sites whose research is situated in the fields aligning with our areas of focus (e.g. Holocaust and genocide studies, antisemitism, Jewish studies, memory studies, etc.), and requires extended access to survivor testimonies.
